



March 2017 parish e-bulletin – news and information from South Cambridgeshire District Council

Welcome to the latest parish e-bulletin. As in every edition, this one includes information that parish councils may want to discuss, important notices we want you to be aware of, as well as news from around the district.

1) Elections – Thursday 4 May

Cambridgeshire County Council and the first ever Combined Authority Mayoral Elections are taking place on Thursday 4 May. We have no scheduled elections, but following the resignation of Cllr Mervyn Loynes there will be a by-election for the Bourn ward. The Bourn ward includes the villages of Bourn, Cambourne, Caxton, Croxton and Eltisley.

Residents must be registered to vote by midnight on Thursday 13 April to be able to vote on 4 May. If they were registered to vote in last year's local elections and the EU Referendum, and returned their household electoral form in the autumn, they will still be registered to vote in May. Residents who have turned 18 or who have moved house since June last year should make sure they are registered. It only takes a few minutes to register at www.gov.uk/register-to-vote

2) Community Chest – more funds available

The Community Chest grant fund re-opens on 1 April with £55,000 available to help voluntary and community groups, charities and parish councils wishing to improve the quality of life for residents in South Cambridgeshire. Applicants can apply for up to £1,000 per project, up to a maximum of £3,000 per parish in the financial year.

4) Greater Cambridge City Deal – A10 cycleway

A shared-use foot and cycleway, the first Greater Cambridge City Deal project to be completed on the ground, was opened on Wednesday 15 March. The new path improves links between Melbourn, Shepreth and Foxton. 5) Greater Cambridge City Deal – Greenways and rural transport hubs

On Wednesday 8 March the City Deal Executive Board approved nearly half a million pounds to develop proposals for 12 cycling 'greenways' in Cambridge City and South Cambridgeshire over the next two years. Greenways are quiet and safer cycling routes. £100k funding was also committed to study the potential of developing rural travel hubs in South Cambridgeshire over the next year.

6) Greater Cambridge City Deal – A428

Plans have been announced to broaden the search area for the new Park & Ride site west of Cambridge. Mott MacDonald have been contracted to evaluate areas for a new site, including areas around Scotland Farm and Madingley Mulch as well as others. The contractors will also evaluate the Local Liaison Forum's proposals for an on-road busway. This information will be presented to the Executive Board later in the year. For scheme details, visit:

Cambridgeshire Constabulary have set up a new online parking reporting system. The information that local people send through will be used to identify parking hot spots, with occasional crack-down days run with targeted patrols of volunteer Special Constables and local Police Community Support Officers. 11) Mobile visitor centre

Highways England has invested in a mobile visitor centre that will allow the A14 improvement team to visit local communities and events. The visitor centre is a 3.5 tonne vehicle with both ramp and step access. It needs a space of 8m x 4m to be set up. An electricity supply would be an advantage, but is not essential as the visitor centre comes fully self-contained with a generator. The project team want to visit as many towns, villages, business premises, local events, libraries, community and support groups as possible over the next few years, to share information about traffic management, scheme progress, possible job opportunities and other topics of interest.
