17-18/52 To discuss highway matters – S Ramus reported that S Bartlett had been contacted by concerned

residents over the severely eroded road markings. She confirmed that S Bartlett would be in contact with County Council Highways to ask if the road markings around the school could be attended to urgently as previously agreed. In addition, questions had been raised as to what if anything the Parish Council could do about the potential withdrawal of the 18 bus service. She advised that the Parish Council would consider supporting the service with funding as part of the local bus group as it had done in the past. However, nothing could be done until a new operator had been found. This service will regrettably cease at the end of August if a replacement is not put in place.

S Ramus confirmed that a meeting with members from Little Wilbraham and Six Mile Bottom Parish Council had been arranged for 7th September to discuss a coordinated approach to issues such as speeding affecting the local roads and any measures that would help improve the situation.

A complaint had been received about the cabling work taking place in Toft Way which had dug up the flower beds laid along the side of the footpath by a resident. S Ramus advised that very little notice had been given regarding this work. Members were disappointed to hear the news as the flowers had made the path look attractive but unfortunately as they had been planted on highways land nothing could have been done to prevent the damage. The Clerk was asked to respond to the resident.
