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Highways, Transport and Cycleways – Village Survey

Introduction

The Parish Council has been successful over the past few years in applying for funding for initiatives aimed at reducing the impact of traffic through our village. This has been made possible by the contribution of the Transport Working Group (TWG) and the active involvement of many of you in supporting surveys which produced the evidence we used in our applications.

The recent improvements include 'gates' and road markings on the entrances to the village, the acquisition and use of the 'MVAS' speed measurement devices and the painting of double yellow lines on the bend by the Carpenters Arms. We have also been informed that the 20mph speed limit through the village will happen soon. In the near future, we are hopeful that a new bus service will be established and we welcome the recent announcement of a feasibility study that could result in safer cycle routes to our adjacent villages.

We remain concerned about a number of issues relating to safety, including the overall increase in the number of vehicles, particularly HGVs, driving through the village and the absence of a pedestrian crossing outside the school. We would like your opinions about further improvements which we might pursue. The Issues

School Pedestrian Crossing.

The PC believes that the 'narrowing' of the road outside the school is dangerous and would like it replaced by a pedestrian crossing. The school's parents' association carried out a survey recently; respondents said that the current arrangement was ambiguous and , as a result, dangerous. The PC has asked the County Council to detail what might be possible, and the approximate cost of different measures.

Heavy Goods Vehicles (HGVs)

Many of you have said that HGVs travelling through the village cause disturbance, particularly to those living on through routes, especially at night and in the early morning. Unfortunately, our ability to lessen the amount of traffic using the village as a legitimate 'through route' to local businesses is limited. The 20mph limit should help, perhaps both directly and by altering the routes recommended by satnav devices. If the speed limit does not have sufficient effect, other calming measures could be applied for.

It might be possible to put controls on vehicles that are not serving local businesses. This might be by restricting those above a certain weight or length, or before or after a particular time. We would like to measure support for such an approach before we start to develop any application.

The road between Little Wilbraham and the Mill Road/High Street junction provides access to most of the village's facilities and resources, such as the school, nursery, pub, shop, playpark, church, memorial hall, social club and dental clinic. It has been suggested this part of the through route should be closed to HGVs, which would then be required to route via Six Mile Bottom, the A11 and possibly Mill Road.
